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MARKET OVERVIEW

After such a long run of tranquil equity markets steadily heading higher, we ran into some volatility in September, as is often the seasonal case. There are many culprits and volatility will likely persist in the months ahead, feeding a bumpier ride to finish what is already a great year for investing. Some concern over the pending start of tapering quantitative easing has bond yields rising. This 'transitory' inflation remains, teaching investors transitory in the inflation world is longer than most think. And then we have an earnings season where inflationary pressures are due to impact company earnings. The TSX dipped 2.2% in September, while pain south of the border was more acute seeing the S&P 500 drop 4.7% (total return, local currencies).

FUND PERFORMANCE AND POSITIONING

Within the portfolio, there were some hits and some misses during the month. Gold names, with a current 4.7% weight, fell as the bullion declined on higher yields. This was more than offset by gains in energy names with natural gas and oil advancing strongly during the month. High bond yields put downward pressure on interest rate sensitives including REITs, health care, and telcos. Financials, which typically gain from higher yields, helped partially offset.

During the month, we did some adding on weakness in the REIT, health care, and telcos sectors. The biggest change was an exit from UPS. Labour pressures are becoming a concern in the

economy, and they are very labour intensive with over ½ million employees. Plus, a track record of stumbles during the busy holiday season was a concern. We also added Virtue Financial, a market-maker based in the U.S. The majority of order flow for ETFs and other investment vehicles flows through companies such as Virtue. We added as low volatility over the past year has pushed the share price done. This company does better when volatility is higher and, given our

view for the rest of the year, this could provide a nice stabilizer.

The Purpose Core Equity Income Fund fell 2.2% during September, bringing the one-year return to 28.3% and 9.0% annualized over the past five years. Given the expectation of higher yields with some inflationary pressures and reasonable valuations in the dividend space, we continue to believe investors should have a healthy allocation to dividend strategies.

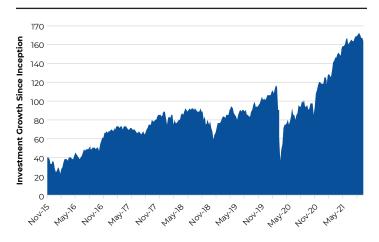
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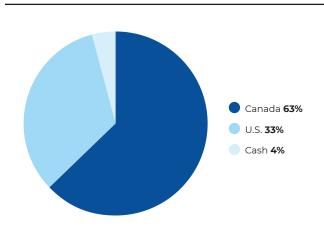
INVESTMENT GROWTH

AS OF SEPT 30, 2021



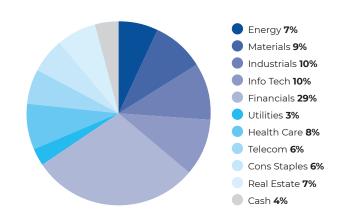
