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MARKET OVERVIEW

2025 is the year that started poorly but is now well on its way to finishing strongly. Having successfully crossed the historically volatile September-October stretch, we are now focused on the potential for smooth sailing through year-end. While headline news continues to rattle markets, the broader firming of the global economy is making the current market advance less sensitive to those transient news cycles. Economic data has improved

globally, with the caveat that much U.S. data is unavailable due to the government shutdown. Critically, inflation has not accelerated and has in fact cooled a bit, which has enabled central banks to cut once again and allowed bond yields to move lower. This environment of lower bond yields translates to multiple expansion for equities, with the added enthusiasm of some Al-related excitement providing the final boost.

FUND PERFORMANCE AND POSITIONING

The Purpose Core Equity Income Fund (F-class PFC2901) delivered a solid gain of +1.63% for October, contributing to a very strong year-to-date performance of 22.5%. This result was achieved against a macro backdrop that has become increasingly supportive of equity valuations. Its momentum was sustained despite the limited visibility from missing U.S. economic data due to the government shutdown, highlighting the market's current focus on robust earnings season results and the underlying strength of the global economy.

Our strong performance was driven primarily by stock selection. From a sector perspective, Communication Services did a lot of the heavy lifting. Both Alphabet (+16.5%) and Rogers (+14.5%) were strong contributors. Rogers seemingly benefited from a solid "Blue Jays bump," with Game 7 of the World Series reportedly being the most-watched event ever on Sportsnet in its history. On the Industrial front, Finning International was also a very strong performer, surging 17% in October. Detractors for the month included stocks in Materials, with Nutrien (-6.5%), Telus (-6.5%), and Pembina (-5.7%). We also saw some weakness in Consumer

Staples as defensive stocks continue to lag broader index returns.

During the month, we continued to add to our position in Cannacord, which is now a full position in the fund. Fortunately, we did this before the stock got a nice little pop on speculation surrounding a potential transaction involving its U.K. wealth management business. We also established a small initial position in Canadian Packers. The trade worked out well, but unfortunately, we did not get as much as we wanted following its spin-off from Maple Leaf Foods. Historically, these types of spin-offs often sell off over the first week or two after the initial event before finding better bids. Following their strong runs, we trimmed positions in Cameco, Finning, and Rogers. This activity allowed us to raise some cash for the fund. The fund still maintains a healthy Tech weight, especially when considering our significant exposure to Google (Alphabet). For valuation reasons primarily, we remain underweight banks.

Markets have moved higher on the valuation spectrum, and many investors are now struggling with what to do. Nobody wants

to leave the party, but there is understandable concern about how long (and far) the advance has gone. We believe the current market has become rather gullible, reacting quickly and positively to announcements and headlines. While this market mood persists, it doesn't feel like the time to be aggressively adding risky exposure. The fund's recent actions harvesting some gains from strong performers and raising cash - reflect our disciplined approach. We believe the ideal path is one of reasonable offence, and our current positioning ensures we have enough market exposure should this happy market continue, but also enough defence and optionality in case weakness materializes. Therefore, we will not leave the party, but we will stand closer to the door.

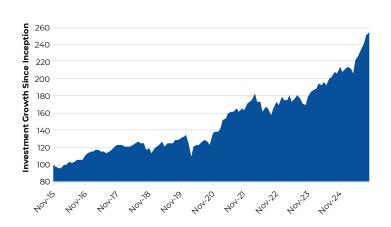

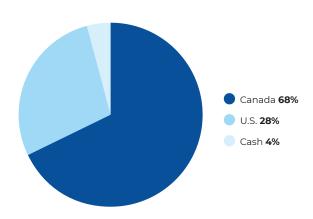

AS AT OCT 31, 2025

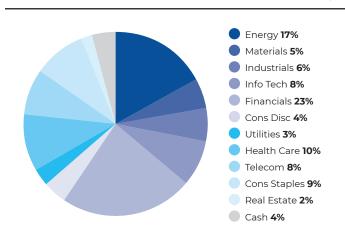
